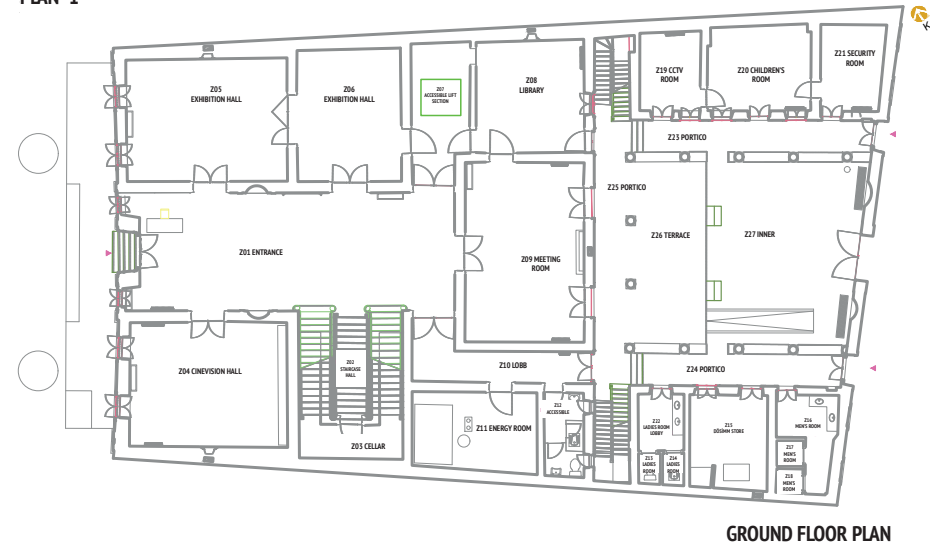
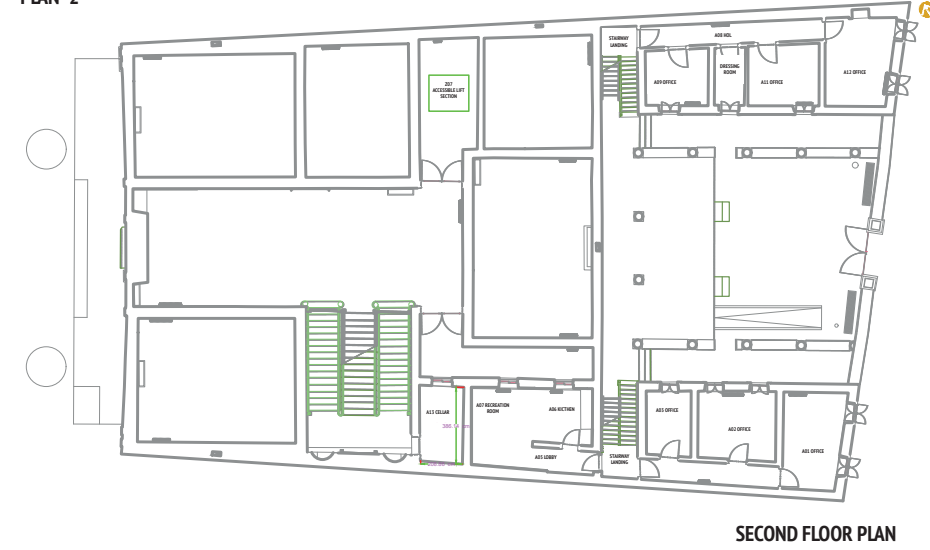

PLAN-1



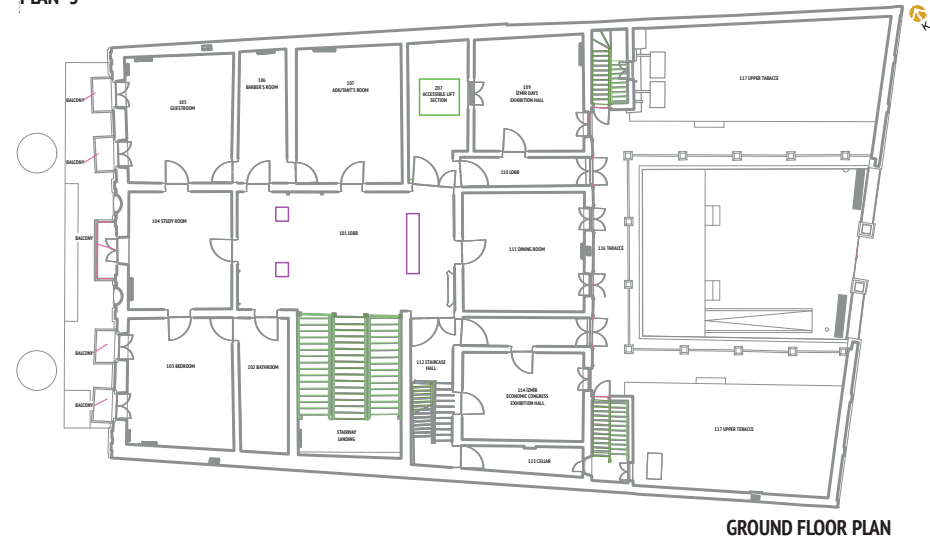
GROUND FLOOR PLAN

The Municipality of Izmir expropriated the building to convert it to a museum on September 25, 1940. The museum was opened its doors to the general public in a ceremony held on 11 September 1941, the 19th anniversary of the visit of Atatürk in Izmir.

Since October 5, 1962, the museum was called as "Atatürk Provincial Public Library and Atatürk Museum of the City of Izmir" The property of the building was transferred to the Izmir Archaeological Museum with the documents numbered 12088 of the Undersecretariat of Culture of the of the Prime Ministry on 28 December 1972. The restored and renovated building was opened to visit as "Atatürk and Ethnography Museum" with a ceremony on 29 October 1978. After the ethnographic objects in the museum were moved to the New Ethnographic Museum, which opened on 13 May 1988, the museum's name was changed to "Atatürk Museum".



The first floor holds the rooms once used by Atatürk These are: Meeting Room, Study Room, Bedroom, Guest Room, Barber's Room, Adjutant's Room, Reception Room, Library, Dining Room and Bath. In the meeting room there is a roulette table covered with green broadcloth complete with 12 cosmos chairs surrounding it. Some scenes from Shakespeare's plays are depicted on the wall tile installed on the backs of 10 small mahogany chairs resting on the walls of the halls.
